- Background in acting, dance/movement, technical theatre, directing, or related discipline
- Strong communication, interpersonal, and organizational skills

- Ability to work both independently and collaboratively
- Current CPR/First Aid Certification (or willingness to obtain)
- Ability to travel independently throughout Youth Theatre's service region
